BEDGROVE INFANT NURSERY ADMISSIONS POLICY 2017/2018

Bedgrove Infant School is a Foundation School and the Governing Body is the Admissions Authority.

Subject to the criteria set out below, children will be admitted to the Nursery during the academic year they are four, without reference to gender, ability or aptitude. The number of children in the Nursery will normally be **60** in the morning and **60** in the afternoon.

Applications must be received after they are two. Normally a child will be offered a place in September if they are four between 1st September 2017 and 31st August 2018. Places will be allocated by the Governing Body according to the following criteria applied in the following order:-

Once children with an Educational Health and Care Plan (Statement of Special Educational Need) have been admitted to the school then places are allocated in accordance with the following oversubscription rules:

- 1) 'Looked after children' or Children in care' i.e. 'A looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became the subject of an adoption, residence or special guardianship order.
- 2) Children living within the catchment area of the school at the time of entry i.e. the area within the following boundaries. (Please note the residence information in the LEA Admissions Booklet)

The home address is defined as the address where the child spends the majority of their school week, Monday to Friday, including nights. Evidence of normal address is required and may take the form of a utilities bill or other official document confirming name and address.

- 3) Siblings of children who will still be in attendance at the Bedgrove Infant and Junior School on the date of admission.

A sibling is a brother or sister, which for admission purposes means one or two or more individuals who have one or more parents in common, or any other child (including an adopted child) who lives at the same address and for whom the parent also has parental responsibility or, (in the case of a fostered child) delegated authority.

To be included as a sibling within the admission rules the other child (sibling) should still be expected to be in attendance when the applicant child joins the school. Siblings are always checked with the preferred school and it would be helpful to know if the existing child has a different family name.

- 4) Children with exceptional medical or social needs supported by written evidence, from a doctor, social worker, education welfare officer or other appropriate person. (Please note you need to provide information see Page 6 in LEA Guide for Parents Admissions Booklet)
- 5) Once the above criteria have been applied, then any further places will be awarded according to the distance between the family's Normal Home Address and the school's nearest open entrance gate, offering the closest first. Straight line distances will be used for measuring home to school distances. (The shortest route will be measured by the Buckinghamshire County Council's Geographical Information System as described in the Buckinghamshire admissions booklet).

Where the school can accommodate some but not all children qualifying within one of the above criteria, a 'tiebreaker' is needed. Where there is only one place available, but two equal distance measurements, random allocation monitored by independent means would be used.

Parents are given a choice of Morning or Afternoon sessions. Should the Morning session become over-subscribed the children will be allocated places in DOB Order, with youngest children taking priority. Should the Afternoon session be over-subscribed then DOB priority will be given to older children.

Once all places are allocated, children will be placed on a waiting list in priority order. Priorities are likely to change, subject to the criteria above, as new applications are made or individual circumstances change.

It should be noted that a place in Bedgrove Nursery does not automatically guarantee a place at Bedgrove Infant School. Applications for school places should be made in line with the Admissions Policy for places at Bedgrove Infant School
